Bicycle shop offers guided luminaria tours for unique perspective of N.M. holiday tradition

ince winter soems to have skipped over New Mexico thus fir, how about an alternative holiday outing with family or friends on a smooth-riding cruiser to see the luminaries in OM Town? This Christmas eve, take a spin with Albuquerque's home-grown Routes Rentals and Tours bike shop along the Lights and Luminarias Holiday Bicycle Tour.

Duke City natives Heather Wess and Josh Arnold started their community-focused business almost two years ago now. Besides the luminaria tour, the owners and their two talented guides. Emily Kagan and Don Tilly, have shown locals and tourists alike the Balloon Fiesta, haunted neighborhoods, wineries and a daily Bosque tour. They lead mountain biking tours in the foothills and single track river trails, too, and in the works are a foodie tour featuring fourcourse dining, a brewery tour and a chocolate tour.

"When we traved we love to park our cars and experience the place." A mold said about the impiration of the business. Both are avid cyclists, frequently bike communiting from their University-area home to work. Before starting Routes, Wess worked in marketing and corporate tourism while Arnold practiced architecture. Now the couple runs every aspect of the business, from leading tours to servicing bicycles.

"We are passionate about advocating on Albuquerque's behalf," Wess said, explaining that they'd both moved away and were drawn back to start something like Routes. People can rent from the Routes fleet of cruisers, hybrids, tandens, road and mountain bikes, and the shop will deliver bikes to hotels on request. Along the tours, guides share history, folklore, trivia and sights such as movie locations and TV backdrops, which may become a Hollywood tour. Stars take advantage of rentab bikes, too, Wess said. "We rented to Arnold Schwarzenegger about to times while he

was here," she laughed. "I didn't know it was him at first and thought he was doing an Arnold Schwarzenegger accent."

During the luminaria tour, the three-speed cruiser bikes with fat yellow tires and red leather seats will be decorated, making riders feel part of the holiday scene. "Being on a bike allows you to cover a larger area... and people are in a great mood."

Besides putting more bikes on the roads and increasing visibility of riders with safe practices. Wess and Arnold are active volunteers with Bikes BQ. Wess is the executive director and Arnold is a board member on this non-profit that educates and advocates to make Alluquerque more blee-friendly. Your nights are consumed

with meetings to keep cycling healthy in Albuquerque, 'Wess said, when that wither snow blows, Routes also rents snowshoe packages for Str, and offiers tours on the Certe Trial and in the Jemez. Typical of winter in Albuquerque, Arnold said they often cent snowshoes and bikes both in the same day.
